Art

Art class has started for the children. Laura Jones, the art teacher, comes to school one to two times per month to teach the children in the Children's Houses about famous artists and about different art techniques. The children really enjoy these lessons and look forward to their time with Laura.

Art to Remember

Emergency Numbers must be local

On the emergency cards, all phone numbers must be local, this includes all emergency contacts. It is for the safety and to the benefit of your child that these numbers must be local. If there is an emergency, the emergency contact that lives far away cannot help.

The week of September 15, all emergency contact numbers were tested. Many of the numbers were long distance, not listed and/or there was no response.

The teachers will again be notifying parents if any of the numbers they wrote down were long distance and must change.

Lunches

The lunches you pack for your child every day are a connection to you and to home. The children look forward to their lunches. They like to see what you so lovingly packed for them. Their faces light up when they are surprised to find a special note in their lunch.

Please be extra careful about what you pack in your child's lunch. Good nutritional habits begin at home. Every day there is more information about not eating trans fats, eating whole foods, not eating high fructose corn syrup, and eating less prepackaged food. *Good nutrition at lunch often times means a good afternoon for your child.*

Your child's nutrition is important to his/her overall health. Proper nutrition can also prevent many medical problems, including becoming overweight,

developing weak bones, and developing diabetes. Good nutrition can provide for good sleeping habits, good concentration, and having enough energy for the day. It will also ensure that your child physically grows to his/her full potential.

Cut up all easily choked on food such as grapes (cut in half lengthwise), baby carrots (cut in half lengthwise), hotdogs (cut lengthwise). Avoid peanuts, popcorn and tough meats. All of these can contribute to choking on food; even more so in an environment of many children all eating at the same time.

Hand Washing

This year all children must wash their hands when they first enter the Casa. By doing this, everyone's health risk will be decreased. Please help us to remind your child. Flu season is just around the corner!
